Levels of Cooperation Scale

Networking: information-sharing

Linkages: agreements which include referrals, intake, interagency consultations, monitoring referral outcomes, and participation in joint planning meetings which usually do not involve sharing of funds.

Collaboration: specific formal agreement to accomplish common purposes including specific allocations of staff time and funds, quantities of services, timeline, use of each other's sites, joint staff trainings and co-sponsorship of events.

Integration: formal horizontal or vertical affiliation or merger of agencies with resultant structural and leadership changes.
