- Enabling services non-clinical services (not direct or public health services) that enable individuals to access health care and improve health outcomes. Includes case management, care coordination, referrals, eligibility assistance, outreach, etc.
- Public health services and systems activities and infrastructure to carry out the core public health functions of assessment, assurance, and policy development, and the 10 essential public health services.
